ACTIVITIES UPON RETURN

Welcome Back Reception-free

Share experiences with other study abroad returnees, learn how to continue your international experience, and access resources upon return.

Semester Abroad Budget Details

Semester Program Costs Billed Through Chapman For Chapman semester/academic year programs, students are billed Chapman tuition, (sometimes) room and board regardless of the cost listed by the program provider/host institutions. Room is calculated based on the average of double occupancy room on campus. Students can utilize federal, state, and (sometimes) Chapman financial aid toward the cost of their semester abroad. Students should verify if their program of choice is an *All Current Aid* program or a *Federal and State Aid Only* program.

Program Application Fee

Apply directly to your program provider/host institution after acceptance from Chapman. An application fee may be required. Check with your program for the amount.

Housing Deposit

Some programs require a refundable housing deposit. This is paid directly to the program provider/host institution. Check with your program for the amount.

Round-trip Flight

\$800-\$1,500 depending on destination and possible airline baggage fees.

Passport/Student Entry Visa

Visit the U.S. Department of State website for new/renewal passport instructions and fees for U.S. citizens. Passports must be valid for at least 6 months after the program <u>end</u> date. Check the Chapman Student Visa Guide for visa contacts, fees, and procedures. Health Insurance/Immunizations Check your program for health insurance and/or immunization requirements. Chapman provides emergency international assistance insurance through ACE insurance.

Travel Gear

Luggage, backpack, money/passport belt, electronics, rain/snow gear, etc.

Local Transportation

Varies by location, city size, and commute time to school. \$10-\$30 per week.

Meals

\$75 - \$100 per week if a meal plan is not included. Buying groceries and cooking is typically cheaper than restaurants.

Course Fees

Courses may require additional fees for materials, excursions, or labs not included in your tuition. Check course descriptions for amounts.

Textbooks

Estimate your typical amount. Textbooks may be free at the host institution library.

Daily Living & Local Cultural Activities

Suggested budget of \$50-\$200 per week for cultural activities, excursions, laundry, and mobile phone plan. Check <u>expatistan.com</u> for cost of living comparisons.
